The Mural Mile

Overview:

Philadelphia is the world's largest outdoor art gallery - the city is home to more than 3,600 murals. In 1984, *Mural Arts Philadelphia* was founded to help eradicate graffiti and has since blossomed into a massive, city-wide project. Explore a small fraction of the murals Philadelphia has to offer on this combination of the two Mural Mile tours. Be prepared to walk!

Why You Should Return:

Nothing defines Philadelphia more than its neighborhoods and mural art. Since you have seen at least twenty murals, in theory, you've been introduced to plenty of neighborhoods that Philadelphia has to offer. With those new areas, comes new experiences for you to make the most of this beautiful city. So, pack your bags and take a day to explore the city.

Transportation:

To get to the mile starting point, take the Market - Frankford Line to 8th Street.

To return to Penn, take the Market - Frankford Line from 8th Street to 34th Street or 40th Street.
