On **June 17**, you will be assigned to a cohort and an academic advisor, who will lead online group advising sessions to assist you with fall semester course registration and planning.

## **Set up your PennKey and Wharton account.**

If you haven't already done so, you should [set up your PennKey](#). This ID and password will enable you to access many systems and services at Penn, including the required summer Canvas course. You can then use your PennKey to [create your Wharton account](#), which will give you access to your Wharton email. Both accounts are crucial to navigating university resources and making connections at Wharton and Penn. Visit the freshman [technology page](#) to learn more.

not grant all your requests, but you will be able to add, delete, or modify courses in your schedule from July 30 through September 10.
